Grades:

The Prehospital Service Post (PAPH) of the Emergency Medical Service and Victim Removal (SME) is intended for the exclusive care of urgent and / or medical emergencies and does not provide assistance to the public health and / or elective network (consultation and / or issuing certificates).

All medical and hospital expenses, or of any nature, and other expenses resulting from the care provided, including medications, will be the responsibility of the company to which the attendee is linked and / or OF THE attended.

Assistance to passengers - in urgent and / or emergency situations - is exempt from the aforementioned payment, since they are already included in the airport tariff (boarding, disembarkation, and connection).

Basics:

Doc. 9137 – AN/898, Part 7, Airport Services Manual, ICAO (International Civil Aviation Organization), Airport Emergency Planning, Second Edition – 1991, Approved by the Secretary General and published under his authority.

Law No. 6.009 of 12.26.1973, Presidency of the Republic - Civil House - provides for the use and operation of airports, navigation facilities and other measures.

Decree nº 89.121, 12.6.1983, Presidency of the Republic - Regulation of Law nº 6.009, 12.26.1983, as amended by Decree-Law nº 2.060, 9.19.1983, which provides for the operation of airports and air navigation facilities.

Concession Agreement for Expansion, Maintenance and Operation of Campinas International Airport, signed on 06/14/2012.

Brazilian Civil Aviation Regulation No. 153, which provides for aerodromes - operation, maintenance and emergency response.

ANAC Resolution No. 432, of June 13, 2017 - provides for the rules for charging and collecting airport boarding, connection, landing and stay fees.
